After a great reunion in Myrtle Beach, Kathy and I are once more home in New Jersey.

This state, like Virginia, has the misfortune of holding state election on odd number years and national elections

on even number years. Of course all the states around us hold their election on the even year so we hear campaign ads every year. We hear New York ads in the north, Pennsylvania ads in the south and of course our own the rest of the time. It seems like elections are running all the time. This year we vote for governor and state Assembly representatives. The Republicans and the Democrats are running neck and neck as I write this but no matter whom wins:

they will have a difficult time correcting the state of affairs in New Jersey.

However, let's not dwell on such mundane items. The reunion this year was one of the best in years according to those who attend on a regular basis! The rooms were good, the beach right out the front door, good hotel entertainment, excellent food, decent size hospitality room, lots to do, nice mild weather and great company with all the members present.

The Ripcordetts raffle on Friday night did very well (\$1622) and the lamp (\$715) and Anna Britt Trust Fund Raffle (\$860) also did well on Saturday night.

At the business meeting attended by about 45 people. I reported the status of the Ripcord Account and suggested that the group could afford to donate the Ripcordetts proceeds for 2009 to the Anna Britt Trust Fund if the

membership so desired. A motion was made and passed to do so. That money added to donations and the money gathered from the Saturday raffle allows us to send a check to the trust fund for \$2,522. This will bring the trust

fund amount up to somewhere in the neighborhood of \$25,000. Not bad for the first year for the soon to be 10 year old young lady.

As I mentioned, our account is in good shape. At the end of the event after paying all the bills, and sending out the trust donation, we have \$32,606 in the bank. Last year our figure was \$29,142. The difference is from dona-

tions, sales of Ripcord items and books and raffle proceeds at the re-union.

Next year it will be 40 years since Ripcord. We will meet in Fort Worth, Texas from October 7 through October 9, 2010 to remember those who did not make it and to greet those that did.

As I sat in my home watching the History Channel on tv, veterans day evening, I couldn't help but think of the man that I only knew for 4 short years, and loved like my own daddy. Layne told me quiet a bit about Vietnam, and Ripcord, as we traveled together across the country on our job. So, I got on the net to learn more about my friend and what he told me about. When I went on the Ripcord page, I found the article that you wrote about our friend. LT., I just wanted to say thank you for for the wonderful words that you wrote about Layne. He was all that and more! He also told me a lot about you, [my ol lieutenant buddy], as he would call you. I got the opportunity to take him to the memorial in DC one year, let me tell you, that was priceless. I videoed him the whole time we were at the wall.
